
CHÂTEAU DE LAMARQUE

Château de Lamarque, has 1000 years of history.

Pierre-Gilles and Marie-Hélène Gromand d'Evry which manage this vineyard, are the 7th generation of the same family.

This family, arrived in the Bordeaux's vineyard in 16th century (Château Haut Brion), then they was also owner of Château Margaux in 18th century.

These two prestigious properties were lost during the French Revolution.

- -Regional Archives show the presence of vines at Lamarque from the XVth century onwards.
- -Medieval Chateau rich in history, belongs to the Gromand-Brunet d'Evry family since 1790. At this time they owned several other domains of which Château Haut-Brion (until 1794) and Château Margaux (until 1806).
- -35 hectares of vines planted on alluvial gravel with a sub-soil of clay, sandstone and red gravels, deep and well-drained.
- -3 distinctive plots each on a gravel mound. One lies within Lamarque village, second is opposite Château Malescasse and the last borders Moulis and counts Châteaux Poujeaux, Maucaillou and Chasse-Spleen
- -Château de Lamarque leans ever closer towards **organic viticulture** and for fifteen years the Gromand **d'Evrys have exercised a revolutionary viticultural system devised by Jean-Pierre Cousinié: Méthode Cousinié**®
